Now when John heard in prison about the things Jesus was doing, he sent word by his disciples to Jesus, asking, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" *Jesus responded, "Go, report to John what you hear and see. Those who were blind are able to see. Those who were crippled are walking. People with skin diseases are cleansed. Those who were deaf now hear. Those who were dead are raised up. The poor have good news proclaimed to them." (Matthew 11:2-5)

During our recent vacation, Dan and I witnessed several amazing scenes from nature. While still in California we stopped at a protected beach where elephant seals were supposed to be. When we first looked down at the beach all we thought we saw were rocks, then something moved. There was a single, male elephant seal. We then walked over and saw a whole beach filled with elephant seals. Yes, they still looked like rocks but now we knew what we were seeing. What an amazing sight.

A little later that day we stopped in a small grove of trees. We heard there would be lots of Monarch Butterflies here. The sign at the entrance to this area said there were over 23,000 Monarchs there that day. Yet, looking around we saw only an occasional one flitting about. We looked up into the trees; all we saw were what we thought were clumps of dead leaves still hanging on. Another visitor suggested we look through the telescopes that had been set up. When we did we saw all the Monarchs clustered together. Another amazing sight.

A few days later as we cruised along the coast of Mexico we were walking our daily laps around the deck. We looked out and saw what we thought were white garbage bags floating in the ocean and wondered who had discarded all these bags in the ocean. Then we stopped and chatted with some fellow passengers. They too were observing the ocean and what was floating in it. They offered their binoculars to us for a moment. It was then we saw that what we thought were white garbage bags were really sea turtles. A day later we saw even more sea turtles, some with a sea birds resting on top of their shells. Still another amazing sight.

How many times do we need help seeing something that is obvious or known to others? How often do others need our help in seeing what we are seeing? Even John (the Baptist) had questions about who Jesus was and needed help from Jesus to see and know that Jesus was indeed the Messiah.

There are many folks in our neighborhoods, work places and recreation places who would like to see Jesus. Like those who helped us see the amazing sights of nature, so we can be the ones to help others see Jesus.

As we take this year's journey to Jerusalem, may our lives be witnesses to God's great love for us through Jesus, the Christ.


Bishop's Lent Letter 2012

Lent is like watching a replay in sports. We already know the outcome. We see it relived each year; from the days of sacrifice and doubt that begin on Ash Wednesday to the victory on Easter morn. As members of the Christian community, we know that victory will come.

Our loving and gracious God makes this Lenten replay available to allow us to pause and watch the play again so that we might better absorb its meaning. These days preceding Easter are marked by repentance and renewal. In the Gospel lesson we see where Jesus withdrew to the wilderness to fast and pray for 40 days before starting his public ministry.

I am inviting you to join me during our 40-day journey of Lent by doing three things:

- **REFLECT.** Pray daily on the conditions of the world in which we live. Pray for the members of this Annual Conference that we will strive to love, respect and work together. Pray that we will also make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world by being God's love with our neighbors in all places.
- **SACRIFICE.** I invite you to join me in the John Wesley fast each week. I will fast Thursday through Friday lunch. You choose when you wish to do it. The Book of Joel reminds us that the Lord encourages us to: "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning. ... Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love ..." (Joel 2:12-13) I, too, encourage you to grow in Grace through fasting.



• **COMMIT.** Commit to the ministry of Africa University by giving \$1 a day during Lent. The \$40 should be given to your church treasurer and sent on to the Conference marked "AU Lenten Offering." I cannot repeat often enough how this three-year campaign to endow scholarships for Africa University will change not only the lives of every student recipient but the lives of their families as well. We can help transform lives in our neighborhood, and around the world.

Even though we know the outcome, we need this replay. We need to understand that even in times of doubt and loss, there is someone beyond ourselves who can see the whole field and help us to call the plays of life and make them. Lent brings us the promise of the risen Christ – the Christ who has overcome all to lead us to victory. Join me during this season of Lent in praying for transformative perseverance, fasting to focus our minds, bodies and spirits, and giving from our abundance.

We are on the winning team. We've seen the replay. But every year we take it in anew, because the victory is always glorious to behold.
