Pastoral Ponderings

LORD, you have examined me. You know me. ²You know when I sit down and when I stand up. Even from far away, you comprehend my plans. ... Where could I go to get away from your spirit? Where could I go to escape your presence? ⁸If I went up to heaven, you would be there. If I went down to the grave, you would be there too! ²³Examine me, God! Look at my heart! Put me to the test! Know my anxious thoughts! ²⁴Look to see if there is any idolatrous way in me, then lead me on the eternal path! - Psalm 139:1-2, 7-8, 23-24 (Common English Bible)

Recently I have been occupying some of my free time by painting woodwork trim. As you probably know, when you paint woodwork it is easy to get paint on the wall or the floor depending on what the nearby surface happens to be. No matter how careful you are, paint will still end up where you don't want it when painting woodwork. Yes, I do know about the availability of tape you can use to keep from getting paint where you don't want it, allowing you to not be quite as careful while painting.

One of the areas I've been painting will not be visible unless you move the washer and dryer. Still, when paint got on the tile floor, I wiped it up. I asked myself why I was being so careful, after all, no one would ever know if there was paint on the wall or the floor. For that matter, who would know if the woodwork was painted at all in that area. I quickly answered my own question with "I'll know what kind of job I've done and I want it to be the best I can make it."

Then I started thinking and questioning further. I began to consider how often we humans justify certain behaviors with excuses such as: this won't harm anyone, except maybe me; or, no one else will know what I'm doing here. It is so easy to make up excuses that sound good for doing what our Christian faith tells us we should be more careful about doing. Continuing in my meditation I quickly realized that even if no other person knows what had been done, God would still know. Bottom line, if our behavior in any way separated us from another or more importantly from God, it is a sin.

The good news of Easter is God still loves us and wants to be in relationship with us. God comes in grace with forgiveness to each of us. God comes with a wet rag to wipe up the paint from where it shouldn't be in our lives. Even if we use tape to make clean-up easier, God comes and pulls up the tape, paint spots and all.

God is with us at all times in all places and in all ways. We simply cannot hide from God. May we each as individuals and as a congregation live out God's love, grace and forgiveness all the days of our lives.



Our Stone Soup meetings will be suspended for the summer. The last meeting will be May 20. Meetings will resume the first Monday in October. Have a wonderful summer!




Trustees

Finance

First and foremost the finance committee would like to thank everyone for the selfless contributions received during the fuel campaign. The total for the 13 weeks was \$1408. The total of the fuel for the parsonage and church from Jan 1 thru Mar 31, 2013 was \$1412. With spring in the air we have covered this expense with flying colors. The figures for the **1st quarter** are as follows:

INCOME: \$25681 EXPENSES: \$25688 NET: \$-7

OUTSTANDING BILLS: \$4450 (MINISTRY SHARES)

Paid toward ministry shares \$463

The remainder of stock investment monies received in 2012 (\$3270) were used to pay the conference for health and pension expenses in 2013 .We still continue to be about \$1300 short each month. The Trustees have allowed us \$7000 to use for the conference. The conference expense each month total is \$2194 plus the ministry shares of \$1638.
